Boil Water Notice Information – City of Gordon Public Water System

During an ongoing investigation of the City of Gordon Public Water System, it was found that, on multiple days and from different locations in the system, the disinfectant levels (total chlorine) were below the required levels. This was recorded as a possible violation.

According to 30 TAC Chapter 290.46(q)(5), special precautions, protective measures, and boil water notices may be required at the decision of the executive director. The public water system must follow these requirements after receiving written notification, and these measures stay in place until the system meets specific conditions outlined in the rules.

The rules (30 TAC Chapter 290.46(q)(5)(C)) also state that the public water system must give all required information to the executive director to show that the system has met the necessary requirements for lifting the boil water notice.

The City of Gordon Public Water System is required to immediately issue a Boil Water Notice for the entire system using a Tier 1 method as described in 30 TAC Chapter 290.122(a)(2). The water system also needs to inform all of its wholesale customers about the notice. Additionally, the system must begin daily monitoring of disinfectant levels (total chlorine, monochloramine, and free ammonia) at the following locations:

- Smokestack and/or New York Hill Restaurant
- Middle of Town (near First Baptist Church, Hink's, or nearby)
- 1602 Dairy Farm Rd
- Intersection of S Main St and I-20

The water system must work closely with the TCEQ Region 4 Office and complete all required steps before the boil water notice can be lifted.

On Tuesday, October 2nd, a week's worth of chlorine sampling results were submitted to the Texas Commission on Environmental Quality (TCEQ), and all results met the required standards. As the next step, TCEQ requested two Bacteriological (Bac-T) samples, which were collected and sent to the lab on Thursday, October 3rd.

On Monday, October 7th, the results of the Bac-T samples were received and sent to TCEQ. At 10 AM, TCEQ granted permission to lift the Boil Water Notice.
